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1.- PRESENTATION

Royal Decree 592/2014, of July 11, 2014, which regulates the external academic internships of university students, establishes that "they constitute an activity of a training nature carried out by university students and supervised by the universities, whose objective is to allow to apply and complement the knowledge acquired in their academic training, promoting the acquisition of skills that prepare them for the exercise of professional activities, facilitate their employability and promote their entrepreneurial capacity."

The Practicum constitutes a space to bring the student closer to their future professional practice and a time for reflection on the theory acquired in the different subjects of the Degree. It allows us to know the reality of the educational center, especially the teaching-learning processes. At the same time, it helps to establish a first contact with the world of work and makes it possible to link the different knowledge, skills and abilities of future teachers with the activities they will develop in professional practice.

3.- LEARNING RESULTS (objectives)

In Practicum I the main objective is for students to carry out observation in the Primary Education classroom and at the school. Specifically, students will focus their practice on the intervention:

- Become familiar with classroom management.
- Know and analyze the practical functioning of the classroom.

At the end of the Practicum I period, students must have acquired the skills described above.

4.- TEACHING AND LEARNING ACTIVITIES

The **8 ECTS** (200 hours) are realized through the following teaching activities:

Seminars (45 hours of theory and practical orientation):

- Orientation and information sessions on the internship process by the Internship Department.
- Training workshops held at CES throughout the internship period.
- Group and/or individual tutorials by the academic tutor.

Internships in educational centers:

- The student will attend the assigned Center where they will always remain under the supervision of a Tutor, for four consecutive weeks, completing the entire teaching day according to the calendar established in the academic year in which they are enrolled.
- At the end of this period, the student will develop the Practicum Report, its defense, as well as the required surveys.

Students also have **80 hours of individual work** to prepare the documentation for the Practicum module.

6.- EVALUATION

6.1. Evaluation Criteria

The student evaluation will aim to assess the extent to which students have acquired the established professional competencies. The CES Academic Tutor will be in charge of grading each student using a numerical grade, as in the rest of the subjects.

The Practicum Evaluation is the result of the qualification of the following:

- **Evaluation by the Professional Tutor/Supervising Teacher:**
 - Continuous evaluation of student performance through the evaluation form prepared by CES (40% of the final grade).
 - The negative evaluation (less than 5) by the professional Tutor means failure in the practicum. The student must enroll in the following course.
 - The student who misses three days from the internship center/entity without justification* or its equivalent in hours absent (15 hours) will fail the Practicum.

- **Evaluation by the CES academic tutor.**
 - Workshops
 - The Tutor rates the participation and learning in the training workshops carried out during the internship period. The student will take a self-assessment test at the end of each workshop (20% of the final grade).
 - This technique will be subject to failure in both ordinary and extraordinary sessions in the case of either unjustified absence* in 50% of the workshops or failure in the same percentage of self-assessments. In that case you will have to enroll in the Practicum subject the following year.
 - Practicum Report:
 - Evaluation of the student's follow-up and grading of the Report through the rubric designed for this purpose (40% of the final grade).
 - The detection of plagiarism, greater than 25% in the Report, implies automatic failure in the Practicum in the corresponding call.
 - The student who fails the Practicum Report in the ordinary call must complete/repeat the Practice Report in the extraordinary call. If the student fails or does not present the Report in the extraordinary call, he or she must complete the entire corresponding Practicum in the following year.



- Interview:
 - Evaluation of the defense interview of the internship process (20%) through the rubric designed for this purpose.

To obtain the final approved grade, it is necessary to achieve at least 50% of the maximum score in each of the evaluation techniques.

In the evaluation criteria, the indications that the SOUAE sends to the teachers of students with a Specific Need for Educational Support will be taken into account.
